

## Medical Dosimetry Program Clinical Internship

Steps for Medical Dosimetry Clinical Internship Placement:

- 1. Clinical Internship begins during the 2nd semester of JPU's medical dosimetry educational program. Since the clinical site must be approved by JRCERT prior to student placement, determination of clinical placement options should begin early.
- 2. Potential applicants are encouraged to reach out to any personal or professional contacts in the radiation oncology profession to determine support for a clinical internship placement.
- 3. Once the applicant has submitted a **complete** application to the university, he/she will be scheduled for an interview with the Program Director. This will be one of at least 2 interviews with university representatives.
- 4. Upon satisfactory completion of the interview with the Program Director, the medical dosimetry program will begin working with the student to obtain a clinical placement if needed.
- 5. Applicants wishing to use one of JPU's clinical sites approved by JRCERT should not contact the clinical site directly. After the first admissions interview with the Program Director is complete, the Educational Coordinator will serve as the liaison between the applicant and the potential clinical site.
- 6. Once a clinical placement is determined, the applicant will be required to have the JPU Intent to Participate Form completed with appropriate signatures and returned to Linda Murphy, Director of Recruitment, at <u>Imurphy@jpu.edu</u>.
